As a result, our volunteer teams pivoted to support our clients and families through telephone and errand support for families and online programming for our Grief support programs for Adults and Children. We also made a successful shift to virtual events. Our annual Hike for Hospice event provided a fun way for participants to hike virtually throughout the

Month of May, Virtual Tree of Hope event in December 2020 and our Humour for Hospice Inaugural event including an online auction in 2020. 





What is Living Every Season?

The Living Every Season (LES) program provides support to adults and their caregivers who are facing the challenge of living with a life-limiting illness. It is a safe, confidential social setting that allows all participants to be authentic, knowing that everyone has both sunny days and rainy days. The program is designed to help participants feel less isolated by joining an empathetic community.

The program is led by the LES Volunteer Facilitator (facilitator) who is trained in the program content and knowledgeable about community resources. Group support allows participants to share concerns and coping skills. The LES program gives participants a regular event to look forward to while providing respite time for their spouse or caregiver.

The LES In-Person Program is designed to give flexible, high-quality support to meet the needs of each community and its participants. Modifications are considered and the topics for programming are endless.


